C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors), and only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games.

C.1. AGE REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to participate in the Lausanne 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2002 and 31 December 2003.

C.2. ADDITIONAL IF REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must possess a valid ISMF license.

D. QUALIFICATION PLACES

The Overall Cadets Nations Ranking of the World Championship and the respective Continental Championship is established by adding the ranking points of all men's and women's athletes per NOC in each event at the World Championship and at the respective Continental Championships. The Overall Cadets Nations Ranking will be published on the ISMF website www.ismf-ski.org after each championship.

D.1.4 If there is a tie for the final allocated quota place(s) in any of the Overall Cadets Nations Ranking listed above (D.1.1, D.1.2, D.1.3), then the quota place will be allocated based in order of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) The NOC with the higher accumulated ranking points from its athletes' individual and sprint (or vertical if sprint event is not organized) event. <i>*This criteria will be ignored should the Continental Championship only organizes the individual and sprint (or vertical if sprint event is not organized).</i>2) The NOC with the higher ranking points in the individual event in both genders;3) The NOC with the higher ranking points in the sprint (or vertical if sprint event is not organized) event in both genders;4) The NOC with the higher accumulated ranking points from its men's athletes' in the individual event;5) The NOC with the higher accumulated ranking points from its women's athletes' in the individual event;
D.2 Men: 14 Women: 14	D.2 2019 ISMF World Championship Nations Ranking D.2.1 The top seven (7) NOCs in the Overall Cadets Nations Ranking at the 2019 ISMF World Championships will be allocated a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women. D.2.2 If the host country is ranked in the top seven (7) NOCs, then the 8 th ranked NOC will be allocated a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women.

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country must participate in the 2018 European – African Continental Championships or the 2019 World Championships to be allocated a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women. The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the Host NOC while respecting the eligibility criteria as detailed in **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

ISMF shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through D.1 immediately after each Continental Championship via the ISMF website. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks from the date of notification to confirm to ISMF and Lausanne 2020 Sport Entries if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in G. Qualification Timeline.

ISMF shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through D.2 immediately after the 2019 ISMF World Championships via the ISMF website. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks from the date of notification to confirm to ISMF and Lausanne 2020 Sport Entries if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in G. Qualification Timeline.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

Any allocated quota places that are returned/not confirmed by the respective NOC will be reallocated with a maximum of one (1) man and/or one (1) woman to the next best ranked NOC not yet qualified on the Men's and/or Women's World Championship Cadets Nations Ranking list that will be published immediately following the completion of the 2019 ISMF World Championship on the ISMF website.

Any remaining quota places thereafter will be reallocated to NOCs which have only been allocated one (1) quota place from D.1 and D.2. The quota place will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC with a second (2nd) best ranked athlete in the respective Men's or Women's Cadets Athletes Ranking List from the World Championships published immediately following the completion of the 2019 ISMF World Championship.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

If the Host Country declines all of its host country places, a maximum of one (1) man and/or one (1) woman will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOCs not yet qualified in the Cadets Nation Ranking of the 2019 ISMF World Championship.

If the Host Country returns some of its host country places, these returned quota places will be reallocated according to "Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places" section.
