C. Eligibility

Athlete Eligibility
<p>All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors). Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate at MINSK 2019.</p> <p>Age Requirements There are no age requirements for athletes competing in Table Tennis at MINSK 2019.</p> <p>Medical and Anti-Doping Requirements To be eligible to participate at MINSK 2019, all athletes must satisfy the medical requirements according to the EOC Medical and Anti-Doping Guidelines. To be eligible to participate at MINSK 2019, all athletes must comply with doping control process in accordance with the EOC Medical and Anti-Doping Guidelines and the EOC Anti-Doping Rules.</p>



D. Qualification Process

The qualification system allows for the participation of the best athletes through a fair and transparent process within the framework of the Olympic Charter.

<p>Three (3) Male Universality Places are made available to eligible NOCs at MINSK 2019. Three (3) Female Universality Places are made available to eligible NOCs at MINSK 2019. The Universality Places will be allocated by the EOC in conjunction with the ETTU by 5 March 2019.</p>

E. Confirmation Process for Quota Places

On 15 March 2019, MEGOC on behalf of the EOC and the ETTU will inform, in writing, NOCs of the athlete quota places they have obtained at the Qualification Event.

By 25 March 2019, eligible NOCs must inform, in writing, MEGOC whether or not they intend to use the allocated quota places and participate at MINSK 2019.

By 10 April 2019, the ETTU will reallocate all available quota places and inform, in writing, MEGOC.



F. Reallocation of Unused Quota Places

If obtained through the qualification process and allocated quota place from is declined by the NOC or is not confirmed by the NOC by the deadline, the quota place in that event will be reallocated to the next best ranked athlete(s)/NOC, not yet qualified, from ITTF World Ranking Lists as of 1 March 2019. This process will be repeated until all places are allocated.
